This week...

This week we began the final unit in the ShalomLearning curriculum titled Shalom שׁלוֹם. We talked about the word shalom שָׁלוֹם and some of the meanings behind it. When the word shalom שַלוֹם is used in the Torah, it always means "peace." In modern Hebrew, we use it to say hello and goodbye. Students discussed the connections between these meanings.

We read a story about two men whose interactions caused a disagreement that was later resolved by a third party. This story illustrated the concept of shalom bayit שַלוֹם בית (peace in the home).

Students began to see how they can help make their home a more peaceful environment. There are different ways of keeping shalom bayit שַׁלוֹם בַּיִת among those living inside. What do you think peace in the home should look like? Feel like? Sound like?

After looking at a map of Israel and understanding how Jews have traveled from place to place over the generations, students discussed Israel as a shalom שׁלוֹם בַּיִת bayit.
